2. Greek Mythology (Choose one):

Heroes, Gods and Monsters of the Greek Myths by Bernard Evslin D'Aulaires' Book of Greek Myths by Ingri and Edgar Parin d'Aulaire

3. <u>Fiction</u> (Choose one):

The Good Earth by Pearl S. Buck Life of Pi by Yann Martel

4. <u>Personal Quest</u> (Choose one and see assignment below):

The Tao of Pooh by Benjamin Hoff The Alchemist by Paolo Coelho

5. Drama (Choose one):

Cyrano de Bergerac by Edmond Rostand
The Oedipus Trilogy (Oedipus the King, Oedipus at Colonus, and Antigone)
by Sophocles

You will be evaluated on your reading of these texts when you return to school in September. It would be a good idea to take notes as you read, especially on the King Arthur and Greek myth books, in order to keep the main characters and events clear in your mind.

<u>Writing Requirement</u>: After reading your selection from category #4 (Personal Quest), write a reflection paper in which you relate one of the ideas from the book to your life. Explain the idea itself, its place in the book, and its connection to some aspect of your life. Use at least one direct quotation and use MLA format. The paper should be one typed page. <u>It is due on the first day</u> of class.
