The following is a list of required summer reading for all AP students. These books will be available at a variety of prices through a range of publishers. All local bookstores cooperate with the school district and purchase multiple copies of the texts for purchase by our students. One such bookstore is Books a Million, located near the Viewmont Mall. Another option is Amazon.com for new and used editions. The Scranton and Abington Libraries also have several of these titles available. Please **read the full texts**, rather than abridged options for each title.

These titles are recognized as texts which college-bound students should read. They represent important concepts in British, American and World literature which will enrich your understanding and inspire meaningful class discussion. Each of these works has appeared on the AP test in recent years, and will help prepare you for this rigorous exam. While they should present some challenge, they should also allow you hours of enjoyable summer reading.

You will be tested on these books the second day of the 2013-14 school year. In order to prepare for this test, it is recommended that you take careful notes on your reading and review these notes during the week prior to the start of school next September.
